NEW DISABILITY EMPLOYMENT

Pilot Program Announced

A new disability employment program is set to be co-designed and implemented by the Federal Government and the BCA.

The Government will invest \$3.3 million in the pilot program, providing people with disability with more employment outcomes and development and advancement opportunities once hired.

Minister for Social Services, Amanda Rishworth, says the Government also wants to test out new ways to create cultural change within businesses to better support people with disability. Both the Government and BCA have already held a workshop with major employer groups and disability employment experts to identify any challenges and begin planning the employment pilot program.



BE SUNSMART ON THE GO

This UV, not heat.

Summer is here and we couldn't be more excited to hit the beach and enjoy the summer sun. But before you step outside, remember to be SunSmart!

We are employing the SunSmart app for the safety of our DSWs, clients and carers. This app helps by taking away the guesswork by telling you when the UV is 3 and above with sun protection recommended for your location.

Here are some features that the app possesses:

- UV and sun protection alerts each day.
- A sunscreen calculator, providing you with the minimum recommended sunscreen application, based on your choice of outfit. Plus, a two-hour reminder so you don't forget to top up.
- Four-day forecast of sun protection times and weather information.
- Live UV levels for major cities, and forecast UV for all other locations.



FREE PROGRAM FOR DISABILITY-LED START UPS BY NDIS

The Victorian government has partnered with NDIS to assist Victorians with the inclusive microenterprise project (TIMP) which was designed by people with disabilities and is for people who are already micro-business owners or have a business idea they'd like to develop.

SINGLE-USE PLASTIC BAN IN VICTORA

What you need to know

From 1 February, single-use plastics, such as straws, cutlery, cups and take-away containers, will be banned from general sale in Victoria.

However, there is an exemption for people with disability who need drinking straws, who can buy them on special request.

There is no requirement for anyone to prove a disability or medical need when requesting straws.

The ban applies to all Victorian businesses and organisations, including nonprofits, but does not apply to people using them privately or at home. You can prepare by:

- deciding if you still need single-use items and where they can be avoided or reduced
- avoiding shortages of alternative items by ordering them ahead of the ban
- finding a source of plastic straws if you choose to exercise an exemption.

LET'S MAKE IT HAPPEN TOGETHER!

Did you know that there are approximately 2.65 million carers in Australia who provide unpaid day-to-day support and care for their friends or family? Carers play a central role in caring for and supporting people with disability in Australia. They provide a family member, partner or friend with regular or ongoing care and help - without being paid. They assist with a variety of personal care, health care, transport, administrative support, cognitive and emotional tasks, household chores and other activities.

Caring for someone is fulfilling but it can also be challenging. It's important for carers to have access to extra support to help them provide quality care. Check out the NEWS page on the IDS website to find out some ways you can prioritise yourself, in order to be a better carer.

We understand how overwhelming it can be to be a carer for a loved one. Often it is reported that carers don't seek help for themselves. But remember that you are an important part of the care team and your well-being is vital to being able to provide the right care.
